## Phlebotomy and ECGs for NHS and private patients

The phlebotomy (blood test) and ECG (heart tracing) services that we offer at the practice are funded by the health service for primary care requests only - i.e. those requested by our doctors after they've seen a patient and decided a blood test or ECG is indicated.

This funding allows us to employ the right number of nurses or health care assistants to perform these tests in a timely manner.

We do not have the capacity to carryout ECGs or blood tests on behalf of private or NHS specialists. It should be noted that neither phlebotomy nor ECGs are core general practice services, they are separately commissioned. We are only able to provide them according to the local funding arrangements.

Locally NHS specialists, in secondary care, are funded to carry out their own tests including ECGs and blood tests.

Private specialists should not be asking NHS primary care to carry out unfunded tests on their behalf.
